

Presentation standards

Title: The title must contain a maximum of 20 words and be written in **heading 1 style**

Abstracts: Abstracts should be a maximum of 200 words and have English and French versions. It must be written in **paragraph style**.

Keywords: 5 to 7 keywords. It must have an English and French version and be written in **paragraph style, and the** keywords must be written after the summary of their respective language.

Practical implications: Practical implications should be a maximum of 150 words. It must have an English and French version. It must be written in **paragraph style**.

****IMPORTANT, YOU MUST HAVE 2 ABSTRACTS OF THE ARTICLE (EN/FR) AND 2 ABSTRACTS OF THE PRACTICAL IMPLICATIONS (EN/FR) FOR A TOTAL OF 4 ABSTRACTS****

Mention of financial support (if applicable): Must be written in **paragraph style**, and it must be written after the 4 abstracts.

Address for correspondence: Must be written in **paragraph style**, and it must be written after the 4 abstracts.

Subtitle: Must be written in **heading 2 style**.

Text: Must be written in **paragraph style**.

Authors: Enter the Author's names in the pub settings. You must also enter each author's affiliation (university, job or research chair). You can also click on the pencil below the title to add authors.

Description: The type of manuscript must be written in the description below the title

Type of manuscript

Scientific article: A maximum of 7500 words is allowed, excluding tables, figures and references.

Popularization texts: A maximum of 1500 words are allowed, excluding tables, figures and references.

Editorials: A maximum of 1500 words is allowed, excluding tables, figures and references.

****No text exceeding the maximum number of words will be accepted.**

Tables:

- Tables must be clearly identified by their number and title
- Tables must be formatted in APA 7th edition
- Asterisks representing significant relationships should be put at the bottom of the table. (e.g., † p<0.1; * p<0.05; **p<0.01, *** p<0.001)

Figures:

- Figures should be clearly identified by number and title
- Legends should be clearly defined

Language of presentation:

You may submit your article in either French or English. However, all papers must be accompanied by abstract and practical implications in the other language. You can ask for help translating the abstracts, but note that many open-access sites offer translation services (e.g. DeepL and Google translation). Abstracts will be reviewed and proofread.

****Please note that the journal reserves the right to refuse any article whose language quality is not acceptable.**

References

- The references used should be at the end of the article.
- References should follow the APA 7th edition style
- References should be listed in alphabetical order
- All references must be clearly identified in the text by the author's last name, year of publication, and page number when appropriate.

Evaluation criteria

The editorial board will judge your article according to several criteria:

- Complete file
- Compliance with presentation standards
- Quality of language
- Subject related to a criminological issue
- Originality, relevance and innovation
